As COVID-19 restrictions lift and life returns to a new normal, the lives of immunocompromised (IC) blood cancer patients remain at risk. Despite being a regular topic in health policy discussions, these patients have not had their voice heard.

Since immunocompromised people do not respond to vaccination, they are not protected against COVID-19. Furthermore, they have a high risk of infection and death and **rely on the help of the community**.

Therefore, we call on your help and consideration to **protect the most vulnerable** who cannot protect themselves.

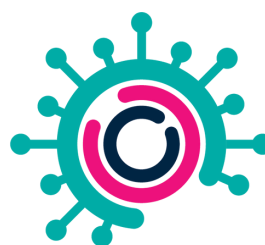
